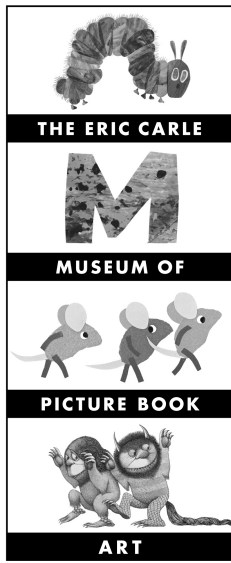


Them Are Anti-Fighting Words (and Pictures):
