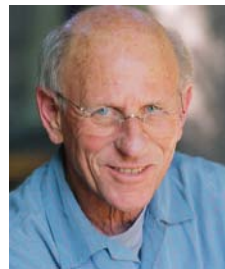

This year's honorees are:

Artist: David Macaulay. The author and illustrator of more than 20 books, including *The Way Things Work* and *The New Way Things Work*, David Macaulay has received numerous awards. In 2006 he was honored with a MacArthur Fellowship, given "to encourage people of outstanding talent to pursue their own creative, intellectual, and professional inclinations."

Angel: Allan & Kendra Daniel. The Daniels, both noted art collectors, are longtime supporters of The Carle and have been engaged with The Carle since our early years. Their personal collection was highlighted in The Carle's 2008 exhibition, *Flights into Fantasy* and the Daniels have contributed a large number of exceptional works to the Carle.

Bridge: Nancy Schön. Schön is a renowned sculptor of public art, including the famous "Make Way for Ducklings" sculpture in the Boston Public Garden. She has brought characters to life through over a dozen prominent public sculptures displayed internationally, and is currently writing a book about her experiences with public sculpture.

Mentor: Stephen Mooser & Lin Oliver, the president and executive director, respectively, of the Society for Children's Book Writers and Illustrators (SCBWI), the world's largest children's writing and illustration organization. Mooser is the author more than 250 books for children. Oliver's production company creates projects based on children's books, including the animated feature of E.B. White's *The Trumpet of the Swan*. She is also the author of the *Who Shrank Daniel Funk* series and the *Hank Zipzer* series.

The evening, featuring cocktails and a dinner reception, will be held at Guastavino's, a stunning architectural landmark complete with soaring granite arches and a vaulted ceiling, situated under the 59th Street Bridge in New York City.
